

Is Your Toilet Running?

The Selkirk Trestle, located just a few blocks away from us, was originally built in 1903 by the Canadian National Railway (CNR). The original structure had a lift section that would be raised by hand to allow the passage of larger boats. This section is still in place but was permanently raised and fixed to allow the passage of smaller boats.

The Trestle is now part of the Galloping Goose trail (part of the Trans Canada trail that traverses the country). The trail is a 55km rail trail that runs along the former right-of-way of the CNR. This old rail trail connected communities all the way from Leechtown (now a ghost town north of Sooke) to the Johnston Street Bridge here in Victoria. In 1996 the trestle was rebuilt and reopened to connect the communities of Burnside/Gorge to Vic West.





Did You Know?

A hot water tank leak can result in significant damages to your unit and those surrounding it. While strata's insurance will cover most of it, the owner must cover the deductable, currently \$10,000. Check with your insurance broker to ensure your policy will cover it.

Additionally, all leakage damage from a tank older than 8 years is the sole responsibility of the owner! Be sure to replace your tank every 8 years and let strata know to update our records by emailing info@strata2720.com
